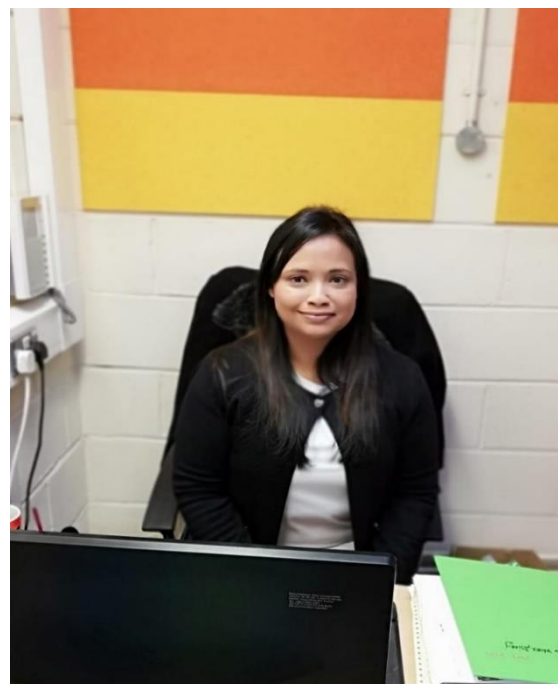
Welcome message from our deputy principal and secretary.....

Questions & Answers

Where are we/Who are we?

The Junior School is situated in Laurel Hill. It has seven classrooms, a sensory room, resource rooms and a large general-purpose area. We also have a large yard with a playground and a sensory garden. We cater for children from 4 – 8 years old and we also have a dedicated class catering for children with mild and general learning disabilities 2 classes for children diagnosed with Autism and an extra class for ASD Early Intervention.

Our school is managed by the Board of Management, comprising of 8 members and we also have a very active Parents Association.

How will your child spend his or her day?

Your child will be taught aspects of the revised curriculum comprising of the following subjects: Gaeilge, English, Maths, Religion, Physical Education, Social and Personal Health Education, Sciences - Social and Environmental, Computers and Ipads, Visual Arts – Music, Drama and Art. Have we any Special Events?

One of our highlights is our Christmas Concert in which every child takes part. Our annual sports day and school tour takes place in the summer term.

During Catholic Schools' week we hold Grandparents Day where we celebrate and thank all of our children's Grandparents who are still with us and those that have passed.

Children also take part in Seachtain ns Gaeilge, local Art competitions and Handwriting competitions. We also hold Maths for Fun, Cuddle and Read and Lego We Do and BeeBots as part of STEM learning where parents can get involved in their child's learning experiences in school. In addition, we are an "Active School" and have a dedicated Active School Week!

What facilities have we in the Junior School?

Our bright, airy and warm classrooms are equipped with their own toilets and with reading activities, number concept materials and digital technology such as iPads, computers and all of our classrooms now have smart screens too. We also have many percussion instruments, maths and science equipment which the children access regularly.

Our yard is stimulating and equipped a lovely sensory garden outdoor space as well as play and climbing frames where the children can enjoy their free time under daily supervision. Finally, we have a sensory room which is a wonderful place carefully designed to stimulate the senses and where the children can relax and explore in a safe and secure environment.

Where do you come in?

We are very fortunate in the Junior School to have an active and hardworking Parents Association who have contributed enormously to our school. Among their notable achievements have been our beautifully equipped playground, our computers and the purchase of a HEPA Filter system for each classroom.

In addition to this, the Parents Association are active in supporting the ongoing development of our school and often subsidise school tours and activities such as Santa's Visit at Christmas, Sports Day treats and lots more. We welcome feedback from the parents on an ongoing basis and we also look forward to including them in all aspects of the children's education. We encourage as many parents as possible to join our

Parents Association as attendance at the PTA meetings are very important and valued.

Our classroom for Children with Special Educational Needs

At the Convent Junior School, we provide educational opportunities for children of all abilities. We are lucky to have a class for children with Mild Intellectual Disability where the pupils are provided with a reduced pupil/teacher ratio and Special Educational Needs support.

We pride ourselves on a model of integration to our mainstream classrooms that is individually designed to enable each child to access their equivalent mainstream class at their own pace and ability. We believe that each student with additional learning needs have different strengths, learning styles, personalities, varied interests and the same need for affirmation and success.

Should you wish for your child to be considered for access to our class for children with Mild Intellectual Disability you can contact us directly to arrange a visit to see how this model works in practice and to discuss your child's individual needs. Please find some brief information below on Mild General Intellectual Disability.

What is a Mild General Intellectual Disability?

The National Council of Special Education (NCSE) outlines that a general learning disability can range from borderline mild, mild, moderate, to severe/profound. Children with general learning disabilities find it more difficult to learn, understand and do things than other children of the same age. They can continue to learn and to make progress all through their lives but at a slower pace than other children. A child with borderline mild or mild general learning disability has very different learning abilities and needs than a child with a moderate or a severe/profound learning disability.

Children with disabilities are children first and have much in common with other children of the

same age. Every child has different strengths, personality and experiences so a general learning disability will impact differently on individual children.

Our classrooms for Children with Autism

At the Convent Junior school as part of our suite of educational opportunities we provide 2 classes for children with a diagnosis of Autism. We aim to offer a positive meaningful educational experience, which allows the child to develop to his/her full learning potential in an environment that offers clarity, routine, stability and calmness.

There will be a maximum of 6 children in each class with a full-time teacher and two SNAs to support them (up to 3 children = 1 teacher and 1 SNA). This allows us to deliver a very personalised and tailored education to meet the individual needs of each child.

Our ASD classes offer an autism specific learning environment within a mainstream co-educational national school. This setting facilitates optimum inclusion in mainstream education as part of the school community as appropriate, with regard to levels of general learning ability, resources and suitability for such inclusion. We wish to provide a broad curriculum which focuses on the abilities and strengths of each child, while supporting their areas of need.

Each child in the class will have access to individual learning stations, quiet zones, our multi-sensory room/facilities, an outdoor play area and trained and supportive staff.

Your child must have a diagnosis of Autism / Autistic Spectrum Disorder made using the DSM-IV/V or ICD 10 by the psychologist or team along with a written psychological assessment /report (dated within the six months prior to the Application being submitted) with a recommendation by the relevant professionals that a special class placement in a mainstream school is both necessary and suitable for the

ASD Early Intervention Class (Age 3-5 years)

We are delighted to announce that in September 2023 we opened our Early Intervention Class for children with Autism. This is a class for children who have a diagnosis of Autism. Entry to the ASD Early Intervention Class is intended to provide support for children with ASD before they start school.

There will be a maximum of 6 children in the class with a full-time teacher and two SNAs to support them (up to 3 children = 1 teacher and 1 SNA). This allows us to deliver a personalised and tailored education to meet the individual needs of each child.

Our aim is to help each child develop and reach their full potential in a holistic manner. We also strive to create the highest possible levels of inclusion and promote understanding, acceptance and appreciation of all children. Opportunities for inclusion are availed of when and wherever possible. This inclusion happens formally and informally, both in the playground in the classroom environment, providing many opportunities for each child to develop academically, socially and emotionally.

Each child in the class will have access to individual learning stations, quiet zones, our multi-sensory room/facilities, an outdoor play area and trained and supportive staff.

Children must be over 3 years of age on entry and cannot be over 6 years of age in the final placement year.

Completed application forms must be accompanied by a psychological report with a written recommendation for an ASD class placement. ***Placement in the Early Intervention Class does not automatically mean a placement in the school going age ASD class.***

Lunch Information

Here at the Convent Junior School we are dedicated to following the Nutrition Standards for the State's School Meals Programme by making sure Healthy Eating Guidelines are met at all times. This means that only healthy food choices that meet the Standards will be provided at our morning supervision club, school lunches, mid-morning snacks and afterschool club. Certain foods and drinks high in fat, salt and sugar will not be offered to children and only milk and water which are the best recommended drinks for children will be served.

The school meals programme is implemented in our school in the following way:

Mid-Morning Snack (10.30-10.40am): A mid-morning snack is provided consisting of a selection of breakfast items that are presented on a platter for the children to choose from, including buttered scones, carrot sticks, pepper slices, fruit pots, rice cakes and water.

The food choices for this meal are presented on a platter as we find that a visual display works very well for the children because they can exercise their independence and choose on a daily basis what they would like to eat. As well as the foods already mentioned, we also provide a selection of seasonal fruits prepared freshly in our kitchen. Including blueberries, raspberries, strawberries, grapes, melons, oranges, apples and bananas. These fruits options are rotated on a regular basis, so the children have plenty of variety and do not get bored!!!

Lunchtime (12.15pm – 12.45pm): A wide selection of sandwiches, wraps and rolls are presented to the children at lunchtime. They come in the form of brown bread, wheaten bread, brown wraps, brown rolls and baguettes all with a mixture of fillings – ham, chicken, tuna, salad, cheese, turkey, chicken tikka, served with butter, mayonnaise etc. Healthy yoghurts, custard and rice pudding pots are also available every day along with breadsticks and fruit. All water served in the school is filtered water of the highest quality and these filters are maintained regularly. All meals are served individually by our staff maintaining all food hygiene standards.

When possible, a hot lunch is provided for the children. Either chicken goujons, sausages, fish fingers served with brown bread or brown roll. As mentioned earlier, if there is a certain food your child likes or does not like please be sure to let us know.

On a more serious note, any **food allergies** MUST be communicated in writing and in person to the principal and the class teacher. We have a strict **no nut policy** in the school as some nut allergies are so severe that even the presence of nuts in the room may cause a reaction. Therefore, to avoid any such incidences we do not allow ANY nut produce in the school. We also do not allow food to be brought in from home as some of our children's allergies are airborne and we cannot risk food being brought onto the premises that may be harmful to another child.

Our school lunches are not pre-packed but freshly prepared in our kitchen by our kitchen staff Deirdre & Eleanor. There is a small cost of €5 per week for school lunch preparation (€1 per day). Lunch money can be put into an envelope with your child's name on it and given to your child to hand in to the class teacher.

Please be aware that food preparation and distribution are carried out adhering to strict hygiene and food standards and complying with all Covid regulations and rules.

Insurance & School Costs

School costs bills are issued every year for every child and they cover everything your child will need for that school year. You will not need to purchase anything as all materials for school such as pencils, crayons, art supplies are included in this bill as well as photocopying costs and 24-hour pupil accident insurance.

We urge parents to pay this bill of €40 as early as possible. Unfortunately we cannot accept card payments as it is very costly for our school to introduce at this time but we are looking into introducing this at some point in the future. In the interim, you can pay via cash or cheque in person, or online via bank to bank transfer as one lump sum, please contact school office for bank details if you wish to choose this method.
